

## Banksia Grove Good Standing Guidelines

The Good Standing policy at Banksia Grove Primary School ensures that all students have a clear understanding of the positive behaviours expected of them and how to maintain their Good Standing in order to participate fully in the rich and diverse range of extra-curricular activities provided.

### Maintaining Good Standing

In order to maintain Good Standing, students are expected to uphold the positive behaviours outlined in the school's Positive Behaviour Matrix and schoolwide expectations. These include:

- Striving to do your best
- Taking responsibility for your actions
- Acting safely
- Respecting others, yourself and the environment
- Supporting and encouraging others
- Adhering to school dress code

### Loss of Good Standing

Students who are not in Good Standing are not permitted to participate in extra-curricular activities or represent the school in special events. Examples of activities include but are not limited to:

- Sporting events
- Leadership responsibilities
- Classroom and whole school rewards including Water Fun Day
- Graduation activities
- School camps

School excursions may be individually negotiated with the school as carer attendance may be required.

### Process

All students have 5 Good Standing points. Students can lose some or all of these points in one of two ways

#### 1. Major incident resulting in suspension

Students involved in a major incident that results in suspension will instantly lose their Good Standing. Students do not need prior warning to lose their Good Standing in these instances.

Families will receive a phone call and an email notification if their child has lost Good Standing and will be informed of any other consequences that they have received, such as suspension.

## 2. Administration Intervention.

Students at BGPS can only lose Good Standing points by a member of the Administration team. If a child requires Admin intervention the team determine how many, if any points are lost. This is then recorded on our Compass system. Parents will receive a phone call regarding the loss of these points and an email once a loss of 4 points have accumulated.

**Decisions around points are made by Admin on a case by case basis with consideration for age and/or individual circumstances and disability.**

### Reinstating Good Standing

After losing Good Standing, students will be provided with the opportunity to regain their Good Standing and all privileges. Students will receive a Good Standing Passport and are expected to demonstrate consistently positive behaviour and uphold school wide expectations, for five consecutive school days. If students do not uphold these expectations during any part of this period, the five-day process will start again.

Additional conditions that apply to reinstating Good Standing include:

- Students who have lost their Good Standing must still attend school
- Students may need to use the buddy class system if their classroom is offsite on any given day
- Good Standing is not negotiable with students or parents
- The five-day process to reinstate Good Standing will commence upon a student returning to school after a suspension period.

Once students have demonstrated consistent positive behaviour for five consecutive days, Good Standing will be reinstated.

Students who lose Good Standing three times in one term are not eligible to regain Good Standing for the remainder of that term. Good Standing will be reinstated at the commencement of the following term.
